

SAV

There are three basic outputs in the SAV strategy:

1. maintain the Bay-wide inventory
2. restore SAV wherever possible
3. enhance understanding that will enable more effective protection and restoration

Most of the workplan elements will require only output measures for management of the CBP effort.

It is not entirely clear what elements in the workplan are CBP workgroup responsibilities versus Partner activities undertaken independently. This is important for accountability and Bay Program resource allocation, and should affect indicator development and reporting.

Climate parameters are of interest primarily in determination of restoration targeting and evaluation of restoration outcomes. The principal parameters appear to be water column temperature, salinity, and sea level rise. Precipitation patterns/trends may be important for future habitat suitability projections. Spatial and temporal monitoring resolution needs to be discussed.
